

PMI Nova Scotia Professional Development events such as Lunch and Learns, conferences, workshops, etc. could be claimed as “Informal Education Opportunities” with Engineers Nova Scotia (ENS). Every two (2) hours of activity qualify as one (1) PDH. The engineer may claim a maximum of 30 total PDH’s per year for this activity, according to ENS terms and conditions.

Reciprocally, Informal Education Opportunities such as Lunch and Learns, conferences, workshops, etc. provided by Engineers Nova Scotia could be claimed as PMI Professional Development Units (PDUs) according to Continuing Certification Requirements (CCR) program requirements.

One hour of activity equals one PDU. You also may report PDUs in quarterly increments. 0.25 PDUs represent 15 minutes of an activity; 0.50 PDUs represent 30 minutes; 0.75 represent 45 minutes, according to Continuing Certification Requirements (CCR) program terms and conditions.
