Professional Development

Darren Spinney - Director

PMI Nova Scotia ran two PMP/CAPM Study Group sessions this year at NS Power, using the new course material selected in 2015. Feedback on the courseware continues to be positive. The material is continually updated by the vendor as PMI makes updates to the programs. Study group participants are provided with a paper copy of the PMPBOK® Guide, 5th Edition and a Student Courseware bundle as part of their registration fee. The Student Courseware bundle includes a Student Coursebook, a Student Workbook with weekly exercises and over 600 PMP exam style questions, and a Quick Reference Study Guide.

Due to the PDU changes, facilitators reach their PDUs in the giving back category after facilitating only 2.5 sessions in a three year period. We have been focusing on initiatives to expand our facilitator base through networking and informal group orientation socials for current and prospective facilitators and have been able to add 8 new facilitators this year. To further support our facilitators, each facilitator is provided with an instructor courseware book, session slides with an additional 40-50 PMP-style question slides with explanations provided in the slide notes.. We are currently working on expanding our Facilitator Welcome Package with tips from existing facilitators.

A Special Thanks to Nova Scotia Power for generously donating classroom space for our study group sessions this year.



My focus for 2016 was the bylaw update project. Out chapter bylaws have not undergone a major overhaul since they were first drafted in 1997/98. Changes in technology and how we operate the chapter have caused some conflicts and inconsistencies within the bylaws to become evident. In 2015, the board, based on recommendation of the executive, initiated a project to update the bylaws. Significant work has been completed over the past year in reviewing the bylaws and aligning them with current operations as well as with the PMI GOC template. At this point, a majority of the major issues have been resolved. The next step is to finalize alignment with the GOC template, followed by submission to GOC for approval. Once approval is received, we will be bringing the bylaws to the membership for ratification.

This year marks the end of my term as IPP, and in a larger sense, the end of my cycle as chapter President. Over the past 8 years volunteering with the chapter, I have had the opportunity to work alongside a large number of very talented people who were all dedicated to the success of the chapter. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all chapter volunteers, but especially so those that take on the commitment of serving at the board level. Without its volunteers, the chapter would not be the



success that it is. I am confident that PMI NS is in good hands and look forward to continuing to volunteer with the chapter in the future
